Please note that we re-open after Easter on TUESDAY 17th APRIL.


Parent Consultations

Our next consultation evening takes place this Thursday 8th March from 4 -6 pm.

This is a chance for all parents to have a 10 minute discussion with your child's key worker and discussion their next steps. Your child's development in the 7 areas of learning in the EYFS was tracked at half term based on general observations on Tapestry, the key worker's knowledge of your child and a detailed handwritten observation which you will also have seen on Tapestry.

In addition a written report has been collated for children staying at the setting next year (those leaving in July 2018 will receive a report in late June).
